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Building the African ecosystem required to scale vaccine manufacturing

To expand the local manufacture of vaccines, diagnostics, and therapeutics.

Enabling the African vaccine manufacturing industry to develop, produce, and supply over 60 percent of the total vaccine doses required on the continent by 2040.

Vaccine Manufacturing Deal Preparation Facility - help manufacturers build compelling business plans for investors and to support project financing for vaccine ecosystem enablers

Regional regulatory and trade policy harmonization.

Outcomes

New Public Health Order – Agenda 2063 \$30 billion over the next 20 years

Prioritizing the manufacturing of vaccines for 22 diseases, including, Covid-19

Establish Capacity and Capability, R&D Centres, such as, mRNA Hubs

Facilitate public-private collaboration. Technology Transfers. Donor recruitment, eg. African Export-Import Bank (Afreximbank).

Eliminating all tariff trade barriers, thus creating a single market with free movement of goods and services. Prioritizing agreements that promote the vaccine trade. Harmonizing trade laws by preventing trade restrictions or bans on vaccines (including COVID-19 and Disease X). Pan-African Payment and Settlement System (PAPSS) in collaboration with the African Export-Import Bank.
